January 24 This month the government announced the form four students results, we had better performance than last year. The students have good and interesting results compare with last year, All Katimba gained the best results, getting division one point 10.



March I have managed to submit chairs and table at Kalenga secondary school, this was the project Kalenga for secondary school from last year from Heswall Rotary Club.

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


It was great to have Matt, one of the founders of SEED, with his family to join us.



















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
