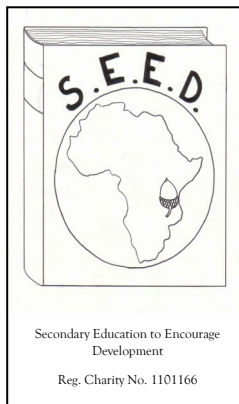

This year we have sixty students in secondary schools, a further fifteen studying at A-level and thirty five students in further education (including university and vocational training).

Our Tanzanian Programme Manager, Deule, not only works with these students but also keeps in touch with past students. These include teachers, tailors, electricians and welders to name but a few. They have been given this chance to seek such employment through the generosity of so many of you including one to one supporters like Highworth Warnford School, who raised over £1000, and other donations like that arranged through the Bromyard Christmas card scheme (Food for All) raising over £150.

Extracts from Deule's reports

In addition to almost daily e-mails, Deule writes a weekly report of all the activities he has carried out for SEED. These are some of the extracts from those weekly reports.....

January 2014 I met with some of the students who wish to join VETA colleges for different courses. Sada pictured right.



February 2014 There have been a few office activities, I have just been away to school for teaching my students. I have been checking on prices for t-shirts, sanitary wear, soap and vaseline for new students and a tailor to make new uniforms.

18 March 2014 Today I made a trip to Kiwere secondary school, as soon as I reach there I went to meet head of the school for short discussion. After that I went to meet students in the class for short stories before starting our class and then I provided t-shirts to our students. The students look so very happy and bright with their new t-shirts, I also provided the pencils case and ruler for the new students.
