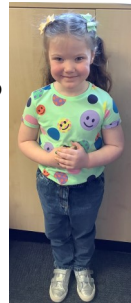
Third prize went to Maurice Nichols in Malvern. The Gin presentation set was gratefully received as he and his wife are Gin lovers!
