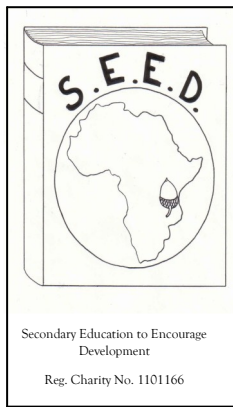

I hope you will enjoy reading about the daily activities of SEED in Tanzania through Deule's reports.

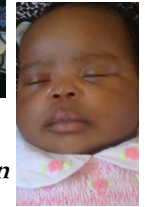

## Extracts from Deule's reports

In addition to almost daily e-mails, Deule writes a weekly report of all the activities he has carried out for SEED. Here are some of the extracts from those reports.

**May 2014** I visited VETA college to meet our students Epifanyo and Veridiana they are going to finish this year. In June they are going to have practical studies for three months, Veridiana will be at Dar es salaam Peacock hotel while Epifanyo will be at Mafinga forest company, hope this practical studies will make them so strong and trained enough to secure jobs.



I made a trip to Idodi secondary with the main aims to continue with entrepreneurship training. I provide mosquito nets to our new students .

I visited colleges to meet Victor and Christian, I met them at Roman church workshop, they are there for practical training in this June session.



**June 2014** I heard the good news that Ruth (former SEED student) has secured a job at Uhuru dispensary at Iringa municipal.



Six students are accepted into form 5 after passing their exams well (A-level).

I received the students from different villages, Teacher Training College and VETA students who came to the office for letter writing.



**July 2014** I used these days to attend new form fives the students are very happy and thank you for your great support, they also wrote letters to their sponsors to let them know about their career and to give their thanks as they are going to start the new life and new class.

....then we started entrepreneur class for form three and four. Students enjoyed so much this subject as they say they can use this knowledge even if they fail to join form five. I provided pocket money to them, they heartily gave thanks for this .



**August 2014** I prepared brochures for primary schools visits, I prepared this paper so that students can have our number to simplify the communication during schools selections. ...also so i can take down all names of vulnerable children for next years programme. These brochures have our charity motto and some short history of the charity... I also contacted all heads of the schools so that they can be aware of my visit.



It was the day I made the trip to Kiwere secondary school just to meet students for the purpose of having the class for Basic English studies touching on some basic elements of speech this was class for form one, two and three. After that I had the class for entrepreneur with form four students as now we are at fourth topic, student's looks so exiting with this VICOBA topic I think it's because in the village there is lots opportunities, so they just imagine how they use them effectively.

**September** Amos Ngailo has been selected to join university of Archbishop Joseph for doctor of medicine. Another fresh and good week where I met with parents of all seed students from each school. The aim was to speak to parents/guardians about what we provide and what we don't provide, to remind the parents over their responsibilities and to participate fully to the raising of the students when they are at school.

**October** It was the day of which **Kiwere secondary school** held the graduation ceremony to say goodbye to their lovely form four students, the ceremony was attended by many parents and invited guests, students were in very good look and happy for the great time they waited for so long time to achieve. They were so happy.

**November** I have prepared some questionnaires for interviews for our new students in 2015. I received some guests who came to ask for the support to their children as the standard seven results are out.
