Covid-19 Update

Although Covid-19 is clearly present in the Iringa district, it does not appear to have directly affected the education of any SEED students to date. (One form 5 student contracted malaria but has managed to catch up on her studies and re-join her peers. Japhet has supported the student with hospital visits. Japhet also continues to help students with access to vision assessments and spectacles).

Although the Tanzanian Government encourages caution and vigilance, mask-wearing, use of hand sanitizer and social distancing are not mandatory at present. The situation on the ground is variable with some schools requiring students to use masks and hand sanitizer while others do not. SEED continues to advise all our students to be as cautious as possible. We continue to provide masks and hand sanitizer to all our students.

The Tanzanian government intends to vaccinate all Tanzanians against Covid-19.

SEED in schools

In addition to the support given by Japhet, students attending Idodi, Kalenga and Kiwele schools receive pastoral care from a nominated teacher. The nominated teacher at Kiwele school has recently been promoted to School Head Teacher. Japhet has asked her to nominate a replacement teacher to cover her duties to the SEED students.



SEED and Higher Education

The Tanzanian government now tries to allocate Form 6 students to University courses of their choice. This is dependent on their performance in the National Form 6 examinations. Loans for contributions to the teaching costs of these courses are available. This is dependent on the course subject as well as the quality of the student's application. Japhet supports the students with choosing appropriate courses and completing the loan application form.

This year, five Form 6 students have gained University places. The courses include Natural Science, Wildlife Management and Law. All five students have been awarded a loan that will cover 100% of their University Education over three years. SEED will provide financial support to these students for the costs of accommodation and food during the University courses.

The Tanzanian government selects a proportion of Form 6 students to undergo a 3-month period of Army Training, immediately prior to starting University. Although selected individuals have no choice about this, our students regard this as beneficial as it provides education and experience in a different part of Tanzania from where they live. The Government funds the training and subsistence during this period, but students have to pay for transport to and from the placement. We reimburse SEED students for these travel costs. This year all five students going to University have been selected for Army Training.

In addition to almost daily e-mails, Japhet writes a monthly report of all the activities he has done for SEED. These are some of the extracts from those monthly reports.....


